NWP Awards 2012 Grant To Goodwill Industries

Nevada Women's Philanthropy (NWP) elected to award its \$350,000 2012 grant to Goodwill Industries of Southern Nevada, Inc. to launch a Veteran Integration Program that will help veterans and their spouses find jobs in Southern Nevada.

"We can't think of a better way to honor those who served our country than to help them find work, especially in this challenging economy. Right now, roughly one out of every seven veterans in Nevada is unemployed," said Steve Chartrand, president & CEO of Goodwill Industries of Southern Nevada. "Helping someone find a job is truly life changing, and we are grateful to Nevada Women's Philanthropy for providing seed funding to develop this much-needed program in our community."

A \$30,000 NWP Founders Gift will be awarded to this year's runner-up, Helping Hands of Vegas Valley and James Seastrand Helping Hands of North Las Vegas.

NWP realigns grant criteria, past winners now allowed to reapply after seven year hiatus

Members of NWP's executive committee, board of directors and the grant outreach committee have unanimously decided to amend the NWP Grant baseline criteria. Starting in 2013, a past NWP grant winning agency will be allowed to reapply again after seven years. Additionally, NWP grant funds must represent at least 30 percent of any proposed project and that applicant agencies have at least \$100,000 in annual revenue to be considered for the NWP grant.

"Each year we make minor adjustments to improve our service to the community," NWP Outreach Committee co-chair, Robyn Manzini said. "However, this year we are particularly excited that past winning agencies will be allowed to reapply after seven years because it is our goal to fund the most dynamic projects led by the strongest leaders possible each year."

This year's grant symposium is scheduled for Jan. 15, 2013 at the Las Vegas Chamber of Commerce from 9 a.m. to 10 a.m.

Following the symposium, the grant outreach committee will hold grant application workshops by appointment on Jan. 21 and 22.

Save the Date for the NWP State of the Community: Jan. 29, 2013 with Jeremy Aguero

Statistician and Policy expert, Jeremy Aguero, is set to reveal what issues and bills we can expect to see in the 2013 legislative session beginning in February and how individuals in Southern Nevada can affect positive policy making in Carson City. Aguero is an extremely rare fourth generation Southern Nevada resident. His family moved here in 1905. He is a 1997 graduate of the University of Nevada, Las Vegas and currently serves on its faculty as an adjunct professor in the business department. He is the founder and principal analyst for Applied



Analysis whose areas of expertise include economic analysis, operational model development and fiscal impact analysis. Aguero's firm compiles statistics and analyzes data to report on everything Las Vegas including real estate market trends, gaming and visitor trends. He is an expert source for gaming businesses and government agencies. He is frequently quoted as a Las Vegas trend-spotter in national and international business stories.
